Allen Barber II, founded the Denver-Hainan Corporation to help state owned enterprise (SOE) executives modernize their companies by identifying potential U.S. partner companies, and then structuring relationships to benefit both sides. His network of Chinese executives, diplomats, government officials, scholars, and media representatives is his source of knowledge of contemporary China, and keeps him well informed of developments and changes within China. support this transition from a planned economy to a market economy that is modernizing China?
